Closed Primary Elections

Florida is a closed Primary state. Only registered party members may vote for partisan offices during a Primary Election. For example, only registered Republicans may vote for Republican candidates, and only registered Democrats may vote for Democratic candidates. This is why it is important to indicate your party affiliation at the time you register. The deadline to change your party is 29 days prior to the Primary Election: February 20, 2024.

Please Note:

Some candidates for US President have reportedly suspended or ended their presidential campaigns.

If a candidate did not submit a formal withdrawal before December 12, 2023, in accordance with Section 103.101(3), Fla. Stat., the candidate's name must remain on the Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) ballot. A vote cast for any candidate appearing on the ballot will count as a vote for that candidate.

Election Security

Voter confidence in the electoral process is a contributing factor to participation and turnout. Our physical security procedures and cybersecurity defenses protect your vote. Elections in Flagler County are fair, accurate, and secure.

Our nation's elections were designated as critical infrastructure by the Department of Homeland Security in January 2017. This important designation allows local election officials many free resources, including access to the latest cybersecurity intelligence information. Your local Supervisor of Elections Office has developed a strong partnership with the DHS to improve our security protections.

Did you know?



The voter registration database and vote tabulation database are maintained independently on separate servers. The tabulation server is held in a closed network with no Internet access.



In order to vote by mail, a citizen must be registered to vote and provide identification at the time of registering. The signature on each returned ballot

certificate must match the signature on file. Each one of the thousands of mail ballot envelope signatures are reviewed by trained Elections Office staff, a process which takes many hours. Each mail ballot signature is reviewed and verified before a ballot can be counted.

All registered voters who reside in the City of Flagler Beach may vote for their City Commissioner, regardless of political party affiliation.

Any registered voter may request their ballot by mail. Request a mail ballot using the form below or call the Elections Office at (386) 313-4170. All voted mail ballots must be received by the Elections Office by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. A postmark does not extend this deadline. Drop boxes (secure ballot intake stations) for mail ballots will be available at all early voting sites during polling hours. Ballots can also be returned directly to the Supervisor of Elections office in Bunnell. The mail ballot request deadline is **March 7, 2024**.
