Flagler County Citizen's Guide To Registering & Voting

This publication will be mailed to each household in Flagler County at the end of January. The mailing includes two Florida Voter Registration Applications and two Vote By Mail Request Forms to ensure each citizen and resident of the county has the opportunity to register to vote, update their voter registration and request to vote by mail for the upcoming 2016 election cycle.

This publication is a FIRST for Flagler County, created and designed by Kaiti Lenhart, your Supervisor of Elections. It was paid for using Federal grant funds.

Not Only A Presidential Election

It goes without saying that this will be a busy Presidential election year. As we elect our 45th President of the United States, Florida will be in the spotlight again as the third largest state and the largest swing state in the nation. One of the early primaries, our Presidential Preference Primary Election is scheduled for March 15, 2016. This type of election happens only once every four years, it is a unique Primary Election for only Presidential candidates. During this election, Florida voters will cast a ballot for US President, narrowing the field and setting the stage for the election night everyone will be watching: November 8, 2016.

Presidential election years are always busy and this one will be no exception. It's important to note that this year is not only a Presidential election cycle, but there are more than 45 offices up for election in Flagler County. These offices represent all levels of government and there are a few Constitutional Amendments in the process of making ballot position this year.

Florida is a **Closed Primary State**, which means if you wish to vote in a partisan Primary Election, you must be a registered voter in the party for which the primary is being held. Voters affiliated with a minor political party or those with no party affiliation (a.k.a. "Independent" voters) only vote for nonpartisan offices and issues during a Primary Election. **Are you election ready?** If you need to change your party affiliation, the change must be made at least 29 days prior to Election Day.

After the Presidential Preference Primary, our regularly scheduled Primary Election will be held on August 30, 2016. Primary Elections are very important. It's possible that some races, such as School Board, referenda issues, political party offices or Universal Primary Contests will be decided during this Primary Election. The deadline to register to vote or change your party affiliation for this Primary Election is August 1, 2016.

The General Election ballot will include the race for the next President of the United States. This election is open to all voters who may choose among the candidates, regardless of party affiliation. Also on the ballot will be any winning candidates from the Primary who face opposition, along with any contested races for Special Districts and Community Development Districts. If the Constitutional Amendments gather enough petition signatures to gain ballot position, they will appear on the General Election ballot. We live in a country with the freedom to choose our elected representatives in government by majority vote. Your vote is your voice! Municipal Elections

All four municipalities in Flagler County have Mayor, City or Town Commissioner, or Council Member offices up for election this year.

Three of these municipalities have scheduled their elections to coincide with the county-wide Presidential Preference Primary. Registered and eligible voters who reside within the city limits of Bunnell, Flagler Beach and Beverly Beach may cast a ballot for any opposed candidates for municipal office during this election to be held on March 15, 2016. City of Palm Coast voters will be electing three offices in 2016: Mayor and two Council Members (Districts 1 and 3). The number of candidates qualified for office will determine if these races will appear on either the ballot during the August 30th Primary Election or the November 8th General Election. Only registered and

eligible voters who reside within the city limits of Palm Coast may cast a ballot for any opposed candidates for City of Palm Coast offices up for election this year. Flagler County Adopt-A-Precinct Program

The Adopt-A-Precinct program was introduced by Supervisor Kaiti Lenhart in August 2015.

This unique partnership with the Flagler County Supervisor of Elections Office will provide an opportunity for local 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations to earn money and serve the community while becoming involved with the elections process. In the State of Florida, all poll workers must be paid for their time and efforts at polling places on Election Day. With the Adopt-A-Precinct program, the Elections Office partners with non-profit organizations who recruit people who are willing to work the polls and donate their wages to the organization. The Elections Office will provide the required training for recruited volunteers to work the polls on Election Day.

The benefits are three-fold:



1. Voters are served by well-trained staff at the adopted precinct
2. The Elections Office gains motivated workers at polling places
3. Everyone benefits from the work the non-profit organization is doing in our community

Eligibility requirements are detailed in the scholarship information below. Completed applications must be submitted by March 14, 2016.



- High school aged home schooled students in Flagler County



The winning cover design is chosen by School Board members and will be used for the entire year. These Voter's Guides are offered to voters who visit the office and we always bring plenty to pass out during special events and voter outreach programs. The winner will receive a \$50 gift card from Supervisor Lenhart and be recognized publicly at the School Board meeting when the winner will be announced.

VOTER OUTREACH

New Residents Voter Packet

We are fortunate to live in a diverse community of people who have moved to our beautiful county on the coast of Florida from places around the world. Flagler County was the fastest growing county for many years in Florida and our voter registration totals reflect that as of January 2016, we have grown into a mid-sized county with over 75,000 voters! To help our new residents understand the laws related to elections in Florida, Kaiti Lenhart has created a New Residents Voter Packet, filled with elections information to help educate citizens who have recently moved to Florida. This packet includes a current Voter's Guide, Election Dates and Deadlines, Vote By Mail Request Forms and information explaining the Closed Primary process in Florida. New residents in Flagler County are welcomed to visit the Elections Office and pick up a New Resident Voter Packet. Ask for your packet at the front counter when you register to vote.

Voter Registration Drives

One of the most important responsibilities of the Supervisor of Elections is to educate voters and encourage citizen participation in the electoral process. Supervisor Lenhart is taking the Elections Office out into the community with a targeted Voter Outreach Program. Elections staff members and volunteers will be on-site at these events to help citizens register to vote or update their voter registration.
